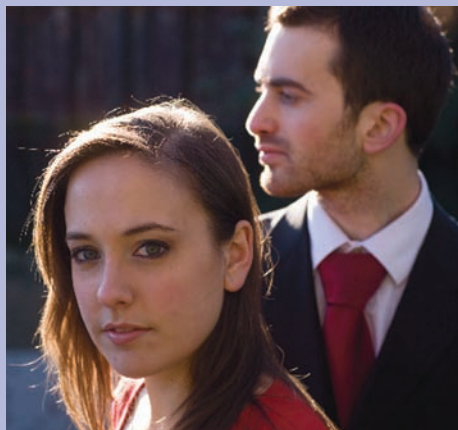

## THE GLENDOWER DUO

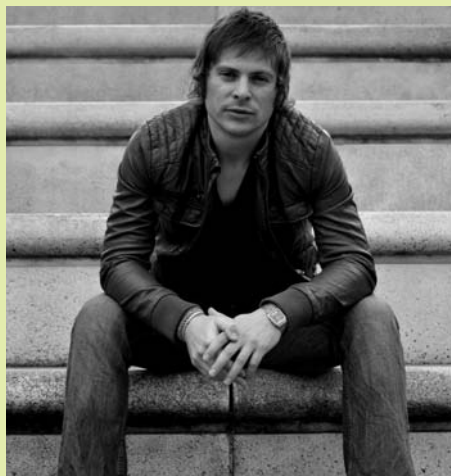
Woodwind Duo
